The Office of School Preparedness and Emergency Planning welcomes Kristina Anderson to present best practices, and lessons learned from a tragic school event. As Kristina is a nationally recognized presenter, this is a presentation not to be missed.

Kristina Anderson was one of the most critically injured students in the Virginia Tech tragedy in 2007. She will share her personal story of the *active shooter* incident, best practices in preparedness and prevention, and lessons learned from her unique perspective as a survivor. She is a dedicated resource for local communities, school administrators, teachers and students in violence prevention and personal safety awareness, promoting joint training between citizens, educators, law enforcement, emergency managers, and first responders.
